





Workforce Development




TCSG's Office of Workforce Development assumed administration of WorkSource Georgia, the state's federally-funded employment and training program in July 2018. WorkSource Georgia provides

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds and technical assistance to 19 workforce development areas across the state.

WIOA funds target training opportunities in high-demand fields, which ensures that participants leave the program with a living wage in a growth industry.

WIOA funds impact:

84% of adult participants gained employment89% of dislocated worker participants gained employment77% of youth participants gained employment or were placed in education opportunities






Complete College Georgia

TCSG is well on its way to meeting the workforce needs of Georgia's industries by 2025, the goal set by Complete College Georgia. The system is ahead of its FY18 benchmark by **32,690** students. These are students who have completed the requirements for an associate degree, diploma or certificate.

Prisoner Re-entry

Adult Education works to make a real difference in the lives of Georgia inmates. In FY18, Adult Education served **5,061** students in Department of Corrections facilities. In addition, GED® mobile testing served **6,001** correctional test takers.


