





# <section-header> Experience Learning Has Positive Effects on Students Less likely to drop out and more likely to graduate from high school. Miss fewer days of school. More confidence in their ability to pursue higher education. Itigher level of engagement with potential career pathways. Slightly higher grade point average Arrisk students are more likely to establish postsecondary education plans if they are involved in the genericital learning.






